# Dear Friends of the BOEC


**W**hat a thrill to report that 2005-2006, our 30<sup>th</sup> Anniversary year, was a turn-around year for the BOEC. Fundraising surpassed expectations by raising \$525,000, exceeding our prior banner year of 2001. The Ski Program and the Wilderness Program ended with record numbers and a significant surplus. And, after a prolonged vacancy in the Executive Director position, the Board hired Bruce Fitch, a veteran outdoor education professional. With this solid foundation established and a renewed commitment to service and fiscal responsibility, the BOEC is excited to further our success into the next 30 years.

Additionally, the BOEC ended the fiscal year in a position to launch a new endowment fund, the Brownell Bailey

Scholarship Fund, a permanently restricted fund that will generate scholarship support for years to come.

We are proud of the accomplishments of the past year and of the last 30 years. We thank our entire network of supporters, donors, sponsors, volunteers, interns and staff. Above all we thank our students who took the leap to attend our programs. We promise to keep the momentum of the BOEC moving forward to provide the best programming possible for people with disabilities and special needs.

# The Year in Highlights

## 2005-2006

**D**ue to the contributions of our generous donors, as well as the success of our programs, 2006 has been a major turnaround year. Two years ago, the BOEC was operating at a deficit. We are very proud to state that a surplus was realized this year, even after depreciation was expensed.

**This year, a record of over \$525,000 was raised from individual, foundation and corporate donors - the most money raised in our 30 year history.**

We distributed over \$148,000 in scholarship dollars to many deserving special needs groups and individuals.

### Adaptive Ski Program

The Adaptive Ski Program conducted 2,696 lessons this season, 32% over budget and the most in its history, due to a record snow year and many return group and individual clients.

Through the support of the Keystone Ski Resort and the Keystone community, the Adaptive Ski Program expanded its programming into Keystone to provide more than 114 lessons, triple the lessons from 2004. The Resort donated a 200 sq. ft. office at the Mountain House base area, a perfectly suited area for getting mono- and bi-skis to the Discovery Lift.

With this auspicious start, the BOEC has formally launched the **Keystone Adaptive Center**, offering one-on-one alpine instruction for individuals with special

needs and, during the summer months, handcycling lessons on Keystone's renowned mountain biking terrain.

### Wilderness Program

The Wilderness Program had a full season providing 3,520 days of programming. It was successful in continuing many long term relationships with agency clients such as the Brain Injury Association of Colorado, Mountain Mentors, The Children's Hospital, American Cancer Society, Mountain St. Vincent's Children's Home and many other schools, parks and recreation programs and agencies serving people with special needs. The BOEC was proud to receive two awards that reflect the value of our programming for our clients:

- The Brain Injury Association of Colorado named the BOEC their "Outstanding Organization of 2005," which is given to an organization that has made life more meaningful for members of the brain-injured community. The award recognizes the BOEC's work with the Outdoor Adventure Challenge Camps for the last 11 years.
- The Rehabilitation Institute of Chicago (rated the #1 rehabilitation hospital in America) recognized the BOEC for our "generous and continued support of the RIC Sports Program." In October, the BOEC conducted a five-day course for these clients, youngsters with congenital deformities and amputees, and provided them with full tuition assistance.

### Professional Challenge

In support of our mission to serve people with disabilities and special needs, we are proud to feature Professional Challenge, a state-of-the-art team building program for corporate and professional groups. This year we provided over 500 program days to over 20 clients, including Johns Manville, Gambro and Johnson & Wales.

### Our Interns

Training people to work with special populations is a critical element of the vision of the BOEC. Acknowledged by the Association for Experiential Education (AEE), the national governing body of experiential education, as a “model program for intern training”, the BOEC’s intern program remains as strong as ever.

In the course of its 30 years, BOEC has trained over 350 intern instructors in a unique, semester-long, experiential format. Twice a year, in the winter and summer seasons, an intern group of 12 educators lives at the BOEC campus while receiving training needed to work with special populations. Many of BOEC’s interns are completing college degrees in the fields of Therapeutic Recreation, Parks and Recreation Management and Experiential Education, while others are here simply for the experience.

The **Blues at Breckenridge** brought the Siegel-Schwall Band and the Chicago Blues Reunion together for a BOEC Benefit Concert and a celebration of the blues. The concert at the Riverwalk Center was a sell-out. People attended from all around the country.

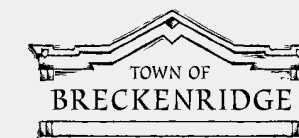

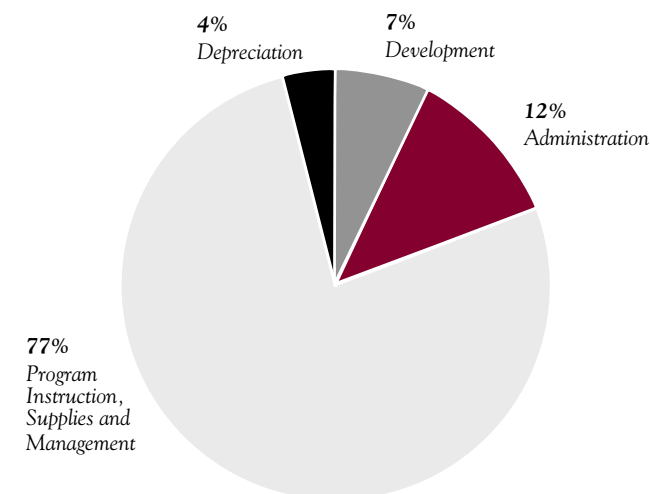

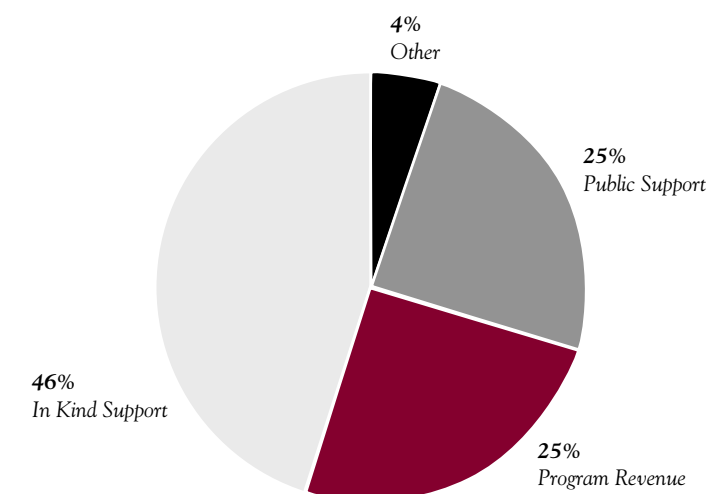
